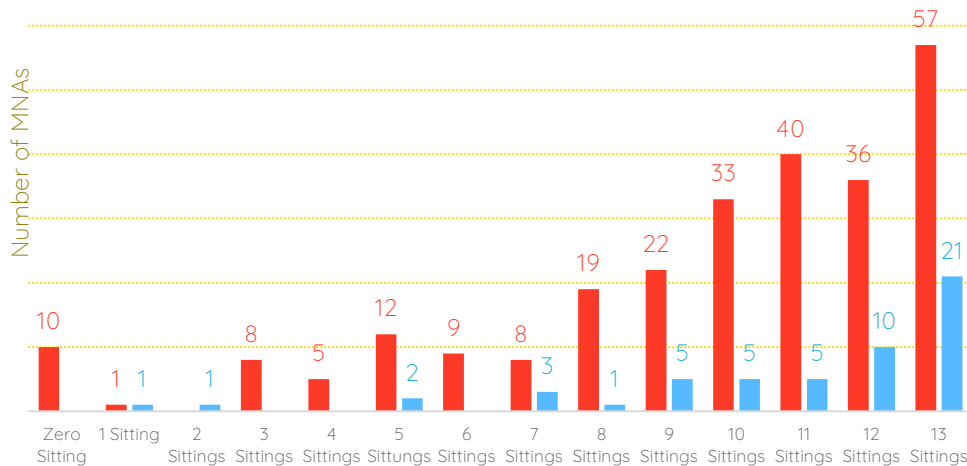

As many as 78 (25 percent) Members of the National Assembly (MNAs) attended all sittings, whereas ten (three percent) did not attend any sitting during the 17th (Budget) session of the National Assembly that spanned over 13 sittings between June 5 and 27, 2025. Following chart shows the gender-disaggregated number of lawmakers grouped by the number of sittings they attended during the reporting session:

Figure 1: National Assembly Attendance, Disaggregated by Gender and No. of Sittings Attended by Each MNA



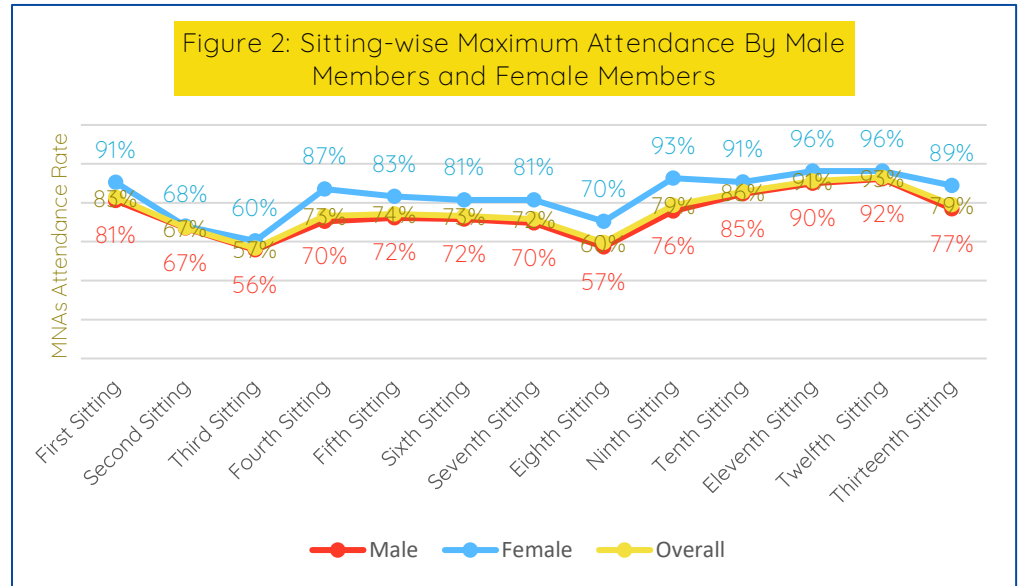
KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- The twelfth sitting had the highest number of MNAs (292 or 93 percent of current membership) present during the session.
- The third sitting had the lowest number of MNAs (177 or 57 percent) present.
- As many as 235 (75 percent) MNAs skipped at least one sitting during the session.
- As Many as 79 (34 percent of 235) MNAs submitted applications for leave of absence during the session.
- As many as 156 (66 percent of 235) MNAs skipped the House proceedings without any formal leave application in advance.
- Among the cabinet members, two federal ministers and three state ministers attended all sittings.
- Prime Minister attended three sitting while the Leader of the Opposition attended all sittings.

Attendance Patterns by Sitting

The attendance of members kept fluctuating during the budget session. It began on a high note, with 83 percent attendance recorded during the first sitting when the Finance Bill, 2025 was introduced. However, as the House progressed into the general discussion on the budget, attendance declined, hitting the lowest 57 percent on the third sitting. The attendance resurged again at 79 percent on the final day of the general discussion, which also included deliberations on Senate recommendations and Charged Expenditures. A marked increase was observed towards the end of the session, with attendance rising above 90 percent during the voting on demands for grants and the Finance Bill. The highest attendance was 93 percent recorded on the day the Finance Bill was passed. The lawmakers raised concern on the absence of government ministers during the budget discussion, prompting the Chair to direct the government members holding finance-related portfolios to come to the floor of the House.

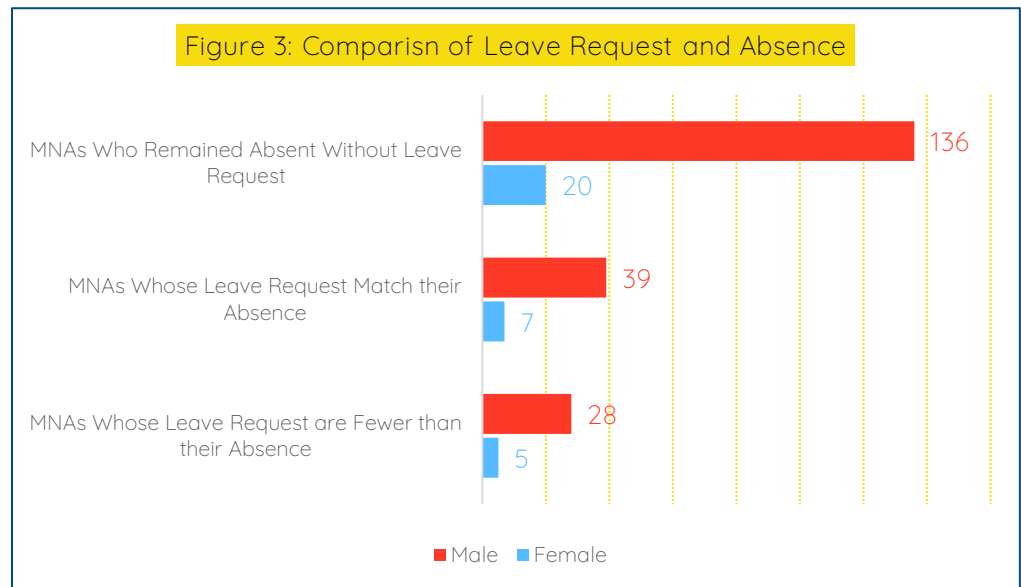
Figure 2: Sitting-wise Maximum Attendance By Male Members and Female Members



Leave and Absence Patterns

An analysis of the attendance and the leaves applications read during the proceedings shows that 235 members 75 percent of the current strength missed at least one sitting during the session. However, only 79 (34 percent) of them submitted an application seeking leave from the House for their absence. Amongst these 79, 13 (16 percent of applicants) applied for leave in advance while 46 (79 percent of applicants) applied ex-post facto during the session after returning from their leaves. The leave applications of the remaining 20 (25 percent) applicants were read on a day falling in the middle of their period of absence. As many as 46 members (58 percent of applicants) sought approval for the entire duration of their absence, while the remaining 36 (42 percent) were

Figure 3: Comparison of Leave Request and Absence

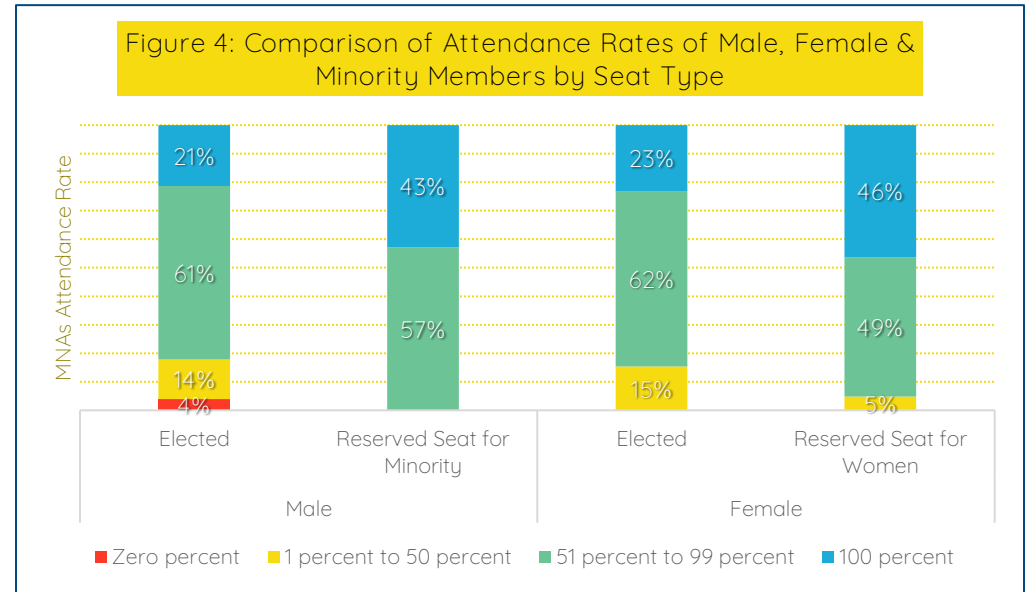




absent for a longer period than the number of days for which they had requested leave. As many as 156 members (66 percent of those skipping at least one sitting) remained absent without submitting any application during the session. Additionally, as many as six MNAs applied for leave of the House for staying absent during the previous session(s). Figure 3 presents a gender-wise comparative of leave request and absence.

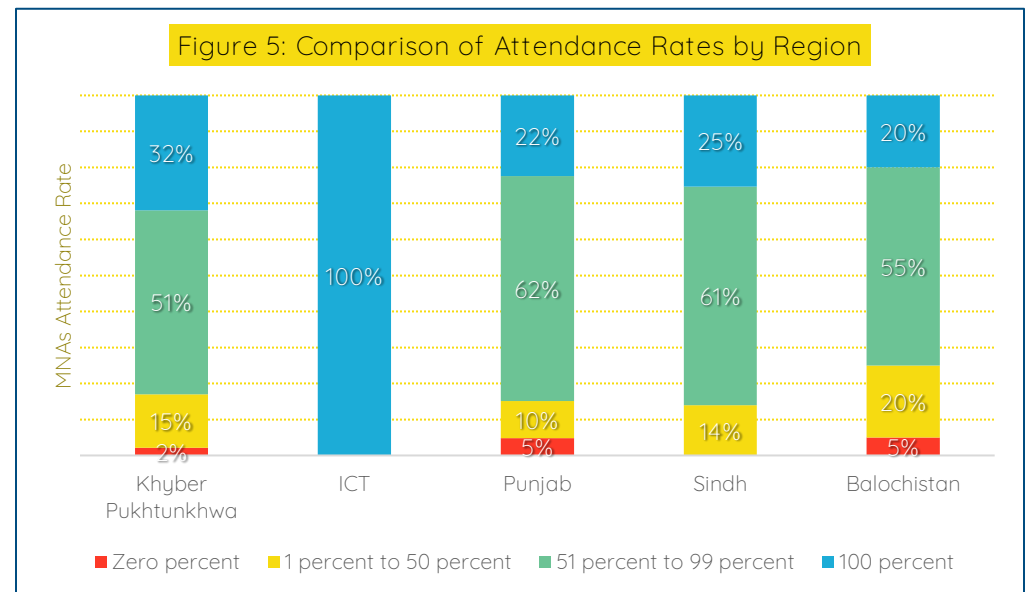
Attendance Patterns by Gender

A total of 22 female MNAs including 19 on reserved seats and three on general seats (41 percent of total female membership) attended all sittings. Among seven minority members, all attended more than half of the sittings including three MNAs who have attended all sittings. Among male MNAs elected on general seats, ten (four percent) did not attend any sitting, 35 (14 percent) were present in less than half of the sittings and 208 (82 percent) attended more than half of the sittings including 54 (21 percent) who were present during all sittings. Figure 4 presents a comparative analysis of attendance rates, disaggregated by seat type and gender.



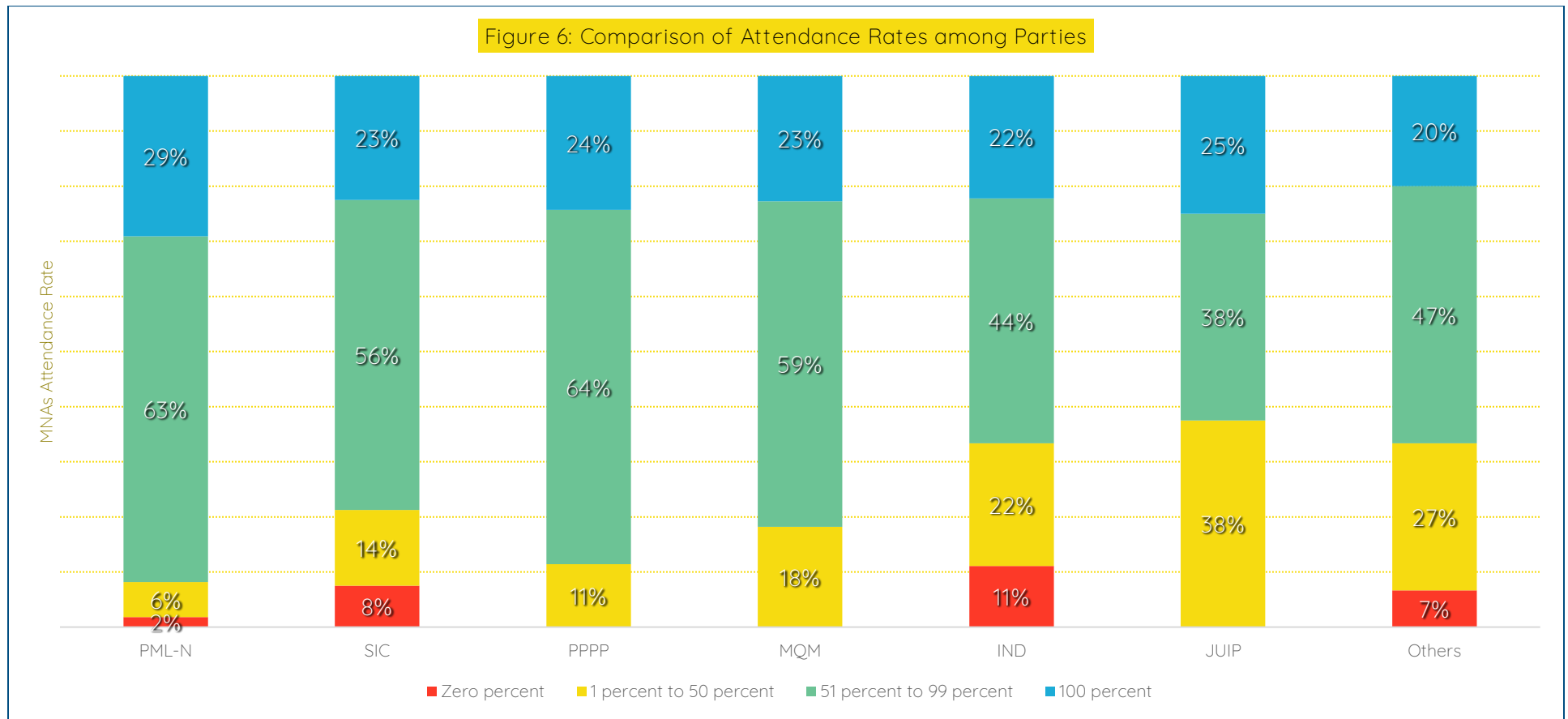
Attendance Patterns by Region

Regionally, across all provinces, the majority of MNAs attended more than half of the sittings. The Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) recorded the highest percentage, with all three of its MNAs attending every session. In Sindh, 68 MNAs (86 percent) attended more than half of the sittings, including 20 who were present at all. Punjab saw 140 MNAs (85 percent) attend more than half of the sittings, with 37 attending every session. From Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, 39 MNAs attended more than half of the sittings, including 15 who were present at all. In Balochistan, 15 MNAs (75 percent) participated in more than half of the sittings. Figure 5 presents a Region wise analysis of attendance rates.



Attendance Patterns by Party

The majority of lawmakers from the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), Pakistan People’s Party Parliamentarians (PPPP), Muttahida Qaumi Movement Pakistan (MQMP), and Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC) attended more than half of the sittings. Sole member of Majlis-e-Wahdat-ul-Muslimeen Pakistan (MWMP) recorded full attendance. Lawmakers from the Balochistan Awami Party (BAP), the National Party (NP), and the Pakistan Muslim League-Zia (PML-Z) attended more than half of the sittings. However, the sole representative of the Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PKMAP) attended less than half of the sittings. Figure 6 shows the attendance rates categorized by parliamentary parties.



The bar titled as "Others" cover all parties with fewer than eight MNAs including BAP, MWMP, NP, PKMAP, PML, PML-Z, IPP..BNP's sole lawmaker has announced submitting his resignation, which is yet to be officially accepted as the National Assembly website currently shows him as a member.



Ministerial Attendance

To allow more time for the general discussion on the budget, the National Assembly suspended its rules requiring the holding of Question Hour, raising of public importance matters, and Calling Attention Notices (CANs). This suspension was approved during the second sitting, which had originally included a Question Hour and CANs related to seven ministries. However, only one of the concerned ministers was present during that sitting.

Given that it was budget session, the agenda primarily focused on matters of finance and revenue. The Federal Minister for Finance and Revenue, who is a Senator, attended nine (69 percent) sittings. The Minister of State and the Parliamentary Secretary for Finance and Revenue, both of whom are MNAs, were present in 11 sittings (85 percent). Notably, the Federal Minister for Economic Affairs, also a Senator, did not attend any sitting during the session despite his portfolio closely related to the issues discussed during the budget session.

Among other cabinet members, the Federal Ministers for Parliamentary Affairs and for the Public Affairs Unit attended all sittings. Likewise, the Ministers of State for Overseas Pakistanis & Human Resource Development, National Food Security & Research, and Religious Affairs & Interfaith Harmony were present throughout the session.

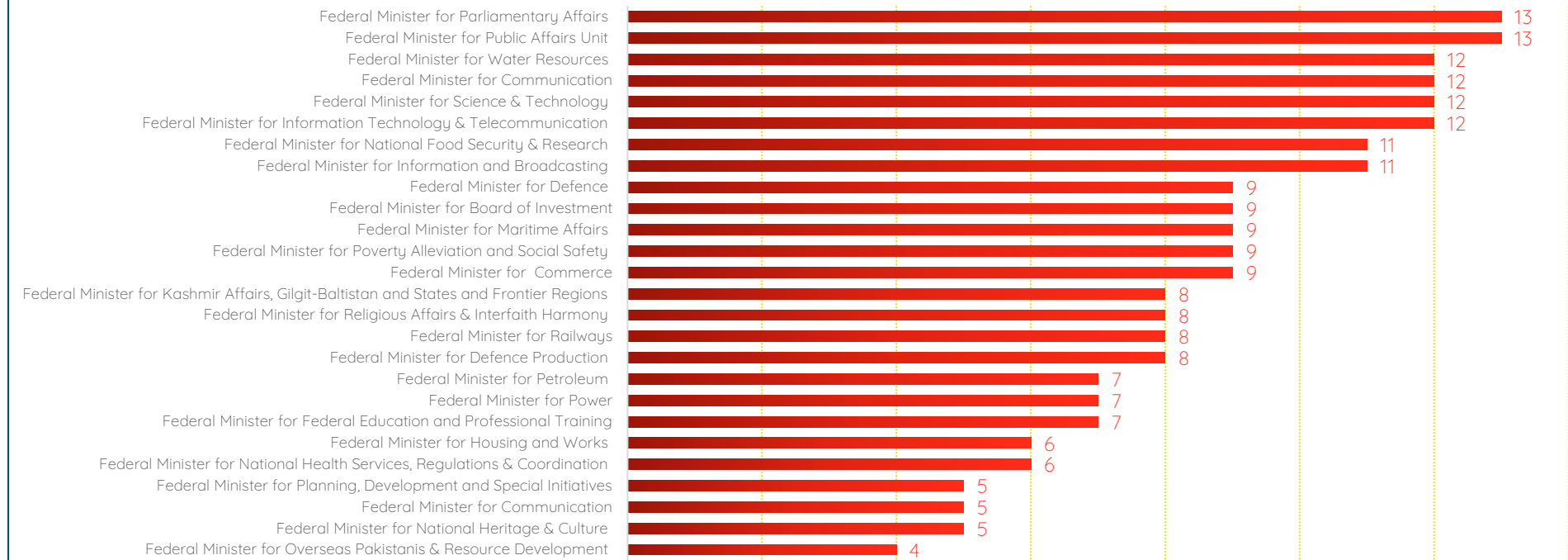
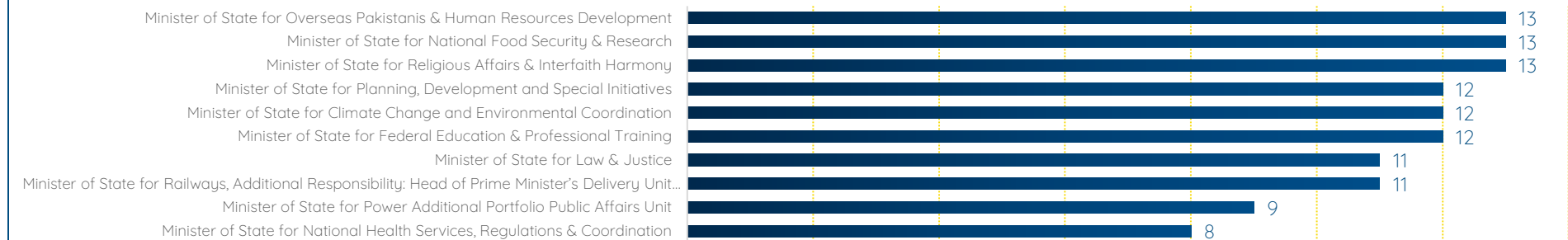


Figure 8: Attendance of State Ministers

Figures 7 and 8 present the number of sittings each cabinet member from the Lower House attended, based on official records available on the National Assembly website.

The incumbent cabinet comprises the Prime Minister and 31 Federal Ministers including 24 MNAs and Seven Senators. The cabinet members from the Senate are not ordinarily required to attend the Assembly's session unless there's an agenda item pertaining to their ministry. In addition to the federal ministers, as many as 11 MNAs hold the office of the Ministers of State and 24 of the Parliamentary Secretaries of various ministries.

Figure 7: Attendance of Federal Ministers who are MNAs

The Attendance Report Card of the Members of the National Assembly of Pakistan is an initiative by the Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) aimed at promoting transparency and accountability by making the performance of elected representatives accessible to the public. Their attendance serves as a key indicator of their commitment to legislative responsibilities, including representing their constituents, contributing to policy debates, and holding the government accountable.

This report presents a detailed analysis of MNAs' attendance during the plenary sittings of the National Assembly's 16th session, held from June 10 to June 27, 2025. It provides insights into attendance trends across regions, political parties, and gender, highlighting levels of engagement among lawmakers. The report relies on the verbatim debates for leave records of MNA.

Since 2010, FAFEN has been systematically observing and reporting on the plenary proceedings of the federal Parliament and Provincial Assemblies. These efforts have significantly contributed to enhancing parliamentary transparency and strengthening the connection between citizens and their elected representatives, fostering a more inclusive and accountable democratic process.
