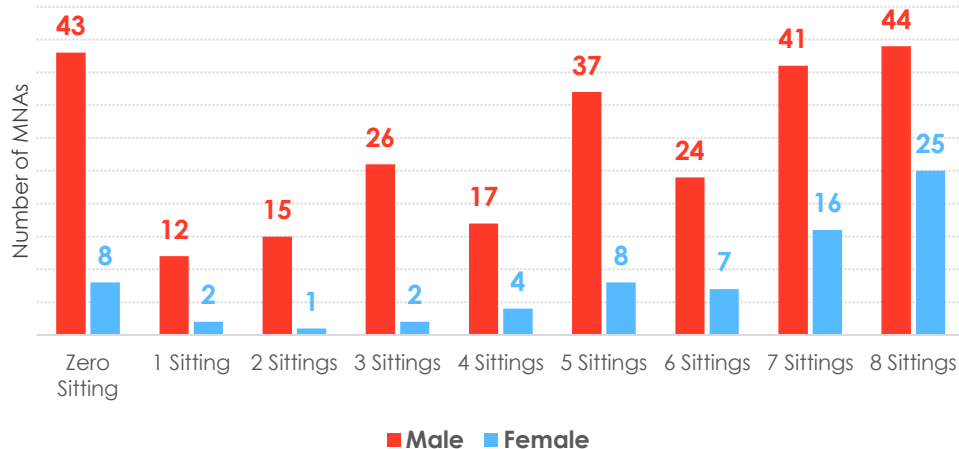

As many as 69 (21 percent) Members of the National Assembly (MNAs) attended all sittings, whereas 51 (15 percent) did not attend any sitting during the 18th session of the National Assembly that spanned over eight sittings between August 4 and 13, 2025. Following chart shows the gender-disaggregated number of lawmakers grouped by the number of sittings they attended during the reporting session:

KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- The eight sitting had the highest number of MNAs (223 or 68 percent of current membership) present during the session.
- The fifth sitting had the lowest number of MNAs (169 or 52 percent) present.
- As many as 262 (79 percent) MNAs skipped at least one sitting during the session.
- As Many as 89 (34 percent of 262) MNAs submitted applications for leave of absence during the session.
- As many as 173 (66 percent of 235) MNAs skipped the House proceedings without any formal leave application in advance.
- Among the cabinet members, two federal ministers and one state ministers attended all sittings.
- The Prime Minister did not attend any sitting during the session.
- The Leader of the House was disqualified from membership only after the House's first sitting. He did not attend the first sitting either.

ATTENDANCE PATTERNS BY SITTING

Like previous sessions, female members' attendance was generally higher than that of their male counterparts during the reporting session. The highest attendance was recorded during the last sitting, with 223 members (68 percent of the current membership) present. As many as three government bills including amendments to the National School of Public Policy Ordinance 2002, Anti-Terrorism Act 1997, and the Petroleum Act 1934 were passed during the sitting. The last two bills were passed after suspending the regular procedure for passage of the bills. The lowest attendance was observed during the fifth sitting, with only 169 members present (52 percent). At the outset of this sitting, quorum was pointed out by an MNA belonging to the SIC, which resulted in the suspension of proceedings for almost 51 minutes. Following the suspension, the House proceedings resumed as it was found to be in order.

LEAVE AND ABSENCE PATTERNS

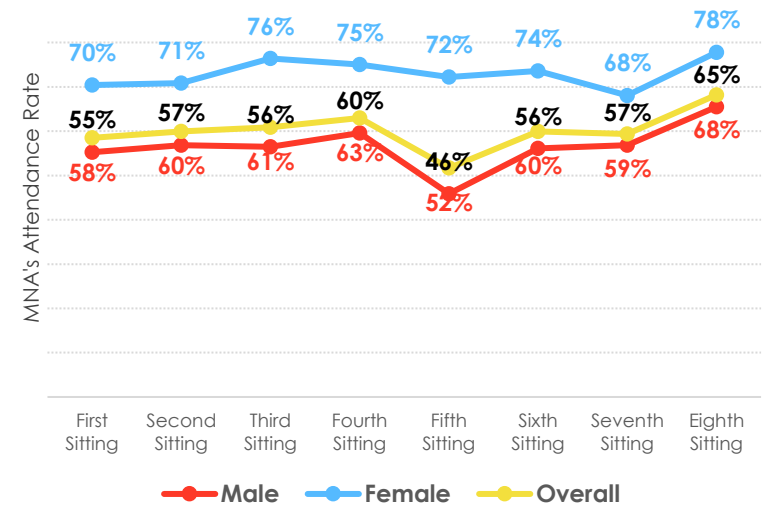
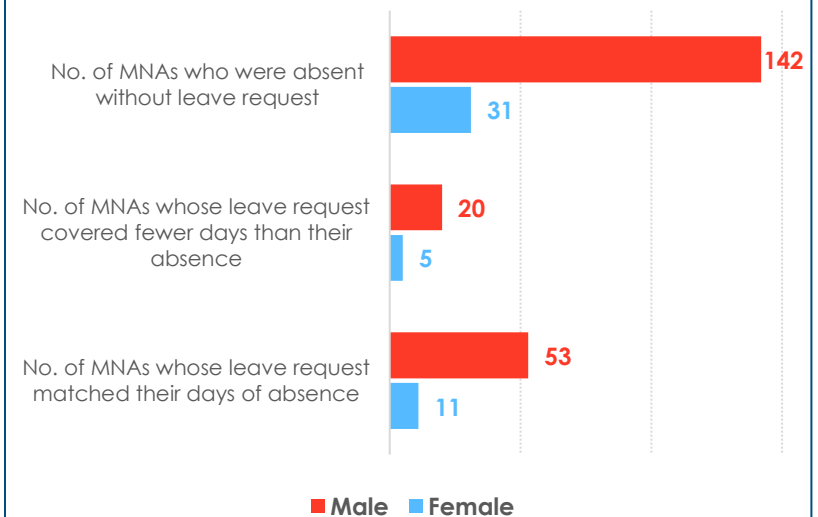


Figure 3: Comparison of Leave Request and Absence

An analysis of the attendance and the leaves applications read during the proceedings shows that 262 members or 79 percent of the current strength missed at least one sitting during the session. However, only 89 (34 percent) of them submitted an application seeking leave from the House for their absence. Amongst these 89, 23 (26 percent of applicants) applied for leave in advance while 29 (33 percent of applicants) applied ex-post facto during the session after returning from their leaves. The leave applications of the remaining 37 (42 percent) applicants were read on a day falling in the middle of their period of absence. As many as 64 members (72 percent of applicants) sought approval for the entire duration of their absence, while the remaining 25 (28 percent) were absent for a longer period than the number of days for which they had requested leave. As many as 173 members (66 percent of those skipping at least one sitting) remained absent without submitting any application during the session. However, they may submit an application in later sessions. Additionally, as many as two MNAs applied for leave of the House for staying absent during the previous session(s). Figure 3 presents a gender-wise comparative of leave request and absence.

Figure 2: Sitting-wise Maximum Attendance By Male Members and Female Members

ATTENDANCE PATTERNS BY GENDER

A total of 26 female MNAs, including 23 on reserved seats for women, two on general seats, and one on the reserved seat for minorities (36 percent of the total female membership), attended all sittings. Among the nine minority members (including one female member), seven attended more than half of the sittings, while one attended less than half, and another did not attend any sitting. Among male MNAs elected on general seats, 42 (17 percent) did not attend any sitting, 69 (28 percent) attended less than half of the sittings, and 139 (56 percent) attended more than half of the sittings, including 43 (17 percent) who were present in all sittings. Overall, male MNAs' attendance showed a noticeable decline compared to the previous session. Figure 4 presents a comparative analysis of attendance rates, disaggregated by seat type and gender.

ATTENDANCE PATTERNS BY REGION

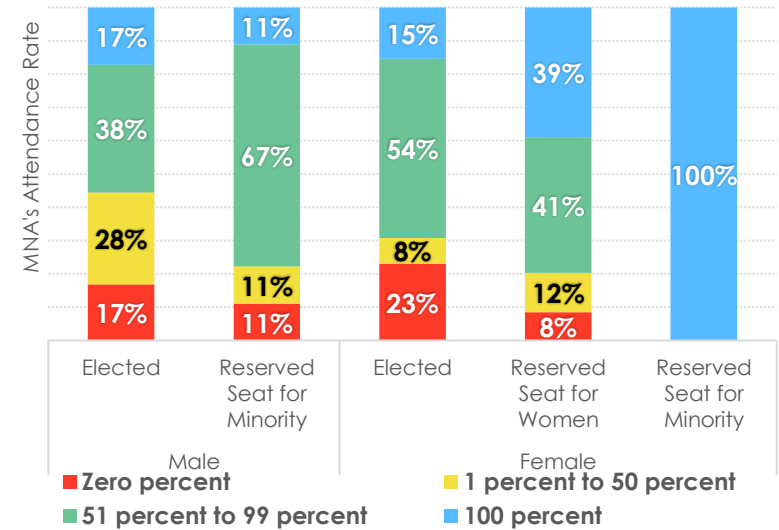
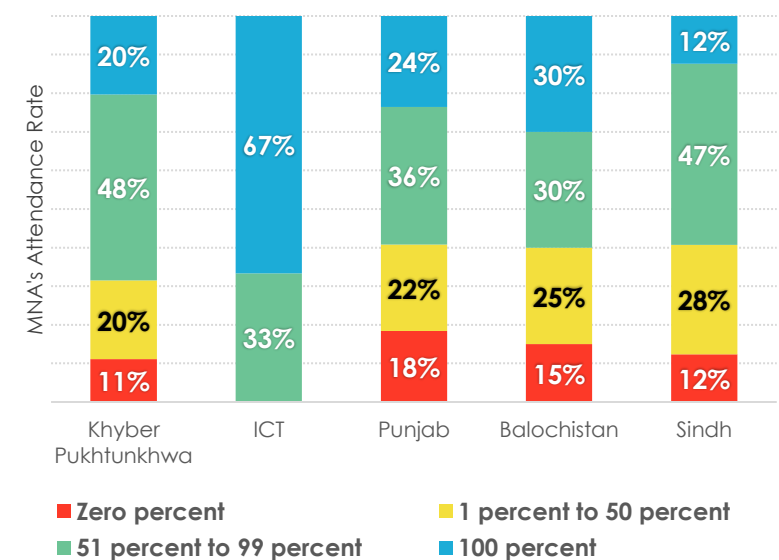
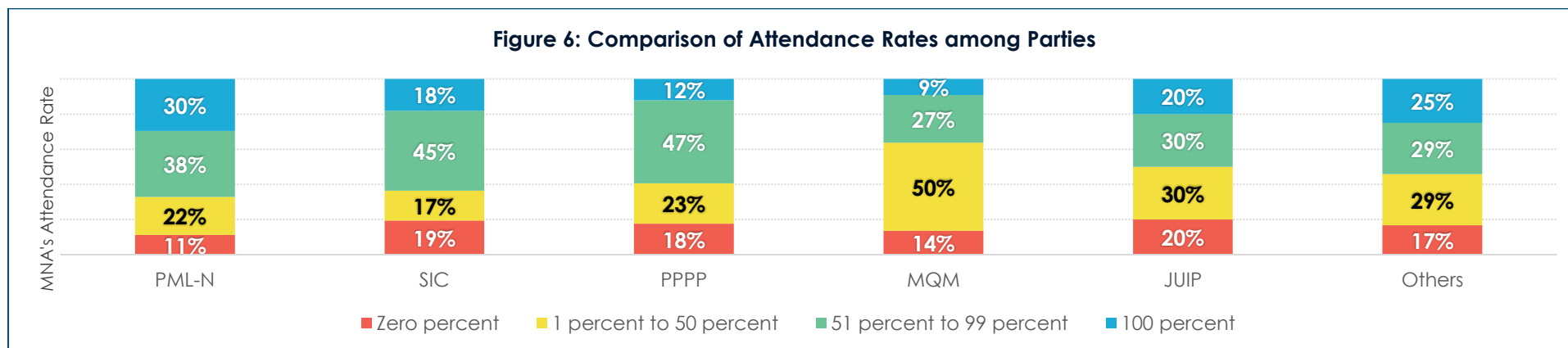


Figure 5: Comparison of Attendance Rates by Region

Regionally, across all provinces, the majority of MNAs attended more than half of the sittings. All MNAs from Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) attended more than half of the sitting. In Khyber Pukhtunkhwa, 37 MNAs (69 percent) attended more than half of the sittings, including 11 who were present at all sittings. Punjab saw 103 MNAs (59 percent) attend more than half of the sittings, with 41 attending every sitting. From Balochistan, 12 MNAs (60 percentage) attended more than half of the sittings, including six who were present at all sittings. In Sindh, 48 MNAs (59 percent) participated in more than half of the sittings including 10 who attended all sitting. Figure 5 presents a region-wise analysis of attendance rates.

ATTENDANCE PATTERNS BY PARTY

The majority of lawmakers from the Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N), Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC), Pakistan People's Party Parliamentarians (PPPP), attended more than half of the sittings. Sole members of Majlis-e-Wahdat-ul-Muslimeen Pakistan (MWMP), National Party (NP) and Pakhtunkhwa Milli Awami Party (PKMAP) recorded full attendance. Lawmakers from the Balochistan Awami Party (BAP) attended more

Figure 4: Comparison of Attendance Rates of Male, Female & Minority Members by Seat Type

than half of the sittings. However, the sole representative of the Pakistan Muslim League-Zia (PML-Z) attended less than half of the sittings. Figure 6 shows the attendance rates categorized by parliamentary parties.



The bar titled as "Others" cover all parties with fewer than eight MNAs including BAP, MWMP, NP, PKMAP, PML, PML-Z, IPP..BNP's sole lawmaker has announced submitting his resignation, which is yet to be officially accepted as the National Assembly website currently shows him as a member.

MINISTERIAL ATTENDANCE

As many as 29 ministers were required to respond to questions during the session. However, 15 of them (52 percent) were absent on the sitting when their attendance was required, nine (31 percent) were present when required, and 17 percent (5 ministers) attended at least one sitting where their presence was necessary. In most cases, Parliamentary secretaries and state ministers were present to respond in the absence of ministers. However, at one instance, the Parliamentary Secretary for Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety admitted that he had not been adequately briefed by the ministry to respond on behalf of the minister concerned. The Speaker also expressed displeasure over the matter and deferred the question. Similar expressions of dissatisfaction from the Chair were observed on two occasions during Question Hour. Most of the sittings when ministers were marked present, they responded to the questions themselves except for one occasion when the Minister for Communication was marked present, yet the questions pertaining to his ministry were responded to by the Parliamentary Secretary concerned. This may be because of late arrival of the minister or early departure from the proceedings.

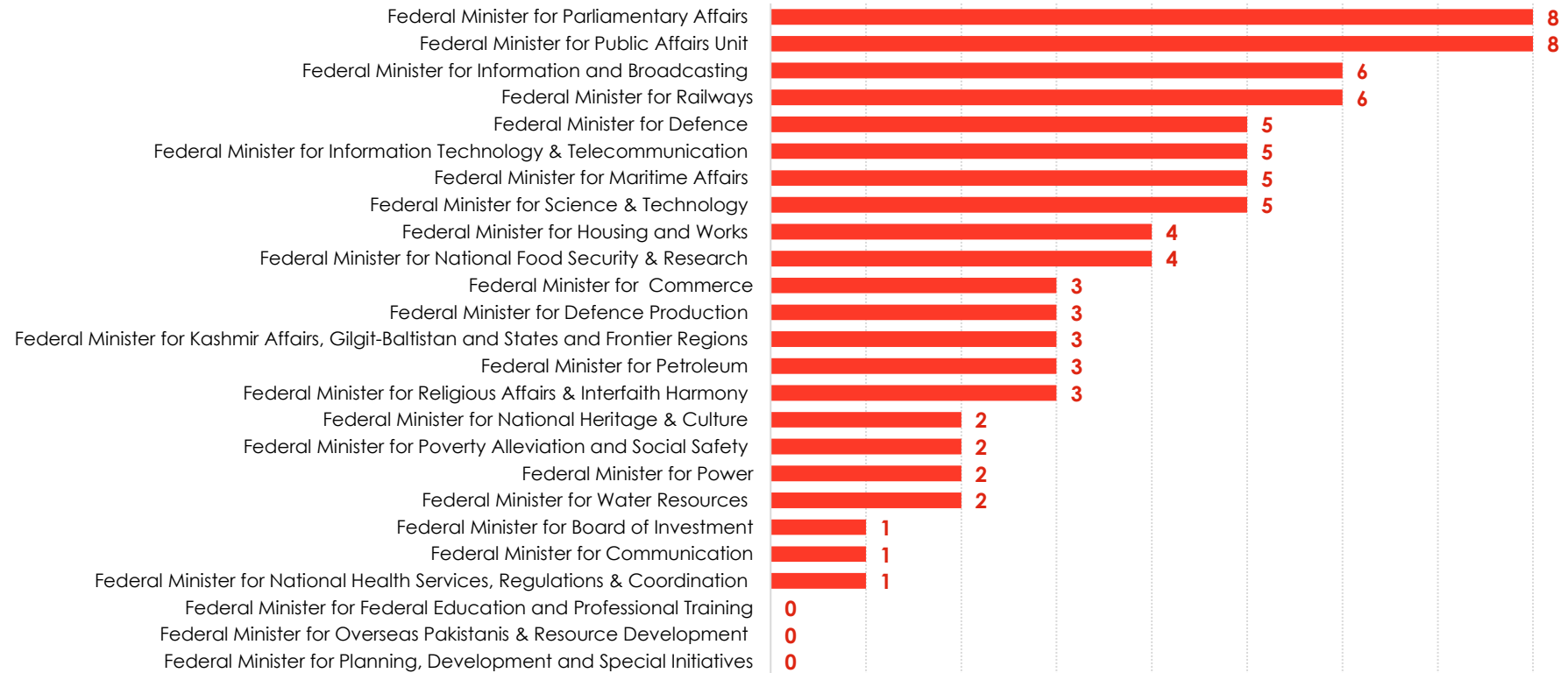


Figure 8: Attendance of State Ministers

Among other cabinet members, the Federal Ministers for Parliamentary Affairs and for the Public Affairs Unit attended all sittings. Likewise, the Minister of State for Federal Education and Professional Training has attended all sittings. Figures 7 and 8 present the number of sittings each cabinet member from the Lower House attended, based on official records available on the National Assembly website.

The incumbent cabinet comprises the Prime Minister and **31 Federal Ministers** including **25 MNAs** and **Six Senators**. The cabinet members from the Senate are not ordinarily required to attend the Assembly's session unless there's an agenda item pertaining to their ministry. In addition to the federal ministers, as many as **11 MNAs** hold the office of the **Ministers of State** and **24 of the Parliamentary Secretaries** for federal ministries.



Figure 7: Attendance of Federal Ministers who are MNAs

The Attendance Report Card of the Members of the National Assembly of Pakistan is an initiative by the Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) aimed at promoting transparency and accountability by making the performance of elected representatives accessible to the public. Their attendance serves as a key indicator of their commitment to legislative responsibilities, including representing their constituents, contributing to policy debates, and holding the government accountable.

This report presents a detailed analysis of MNAs' attendance during the plenary sittings of the National Assembly's 16th session, held from August 4 to August 13, 2025. It provides insights into attendance trends across regions, political parties, and gender, highlighting levels of engagement among lawmakers. The report relies on the verbatim debates for leave records of MNA.

Since 2010, FAFEN has been systematically observing and reporting on the plenary proceedings of the federal Parliament and Provincial Assemblies. These efforts have significantly contributed to enhancing parliamentary transparency and strengthening the connection between citizens and their elected representatives, fostering a more inclusive and accountable democratic process.
