Members of National Assembly Attendance

23rd Session

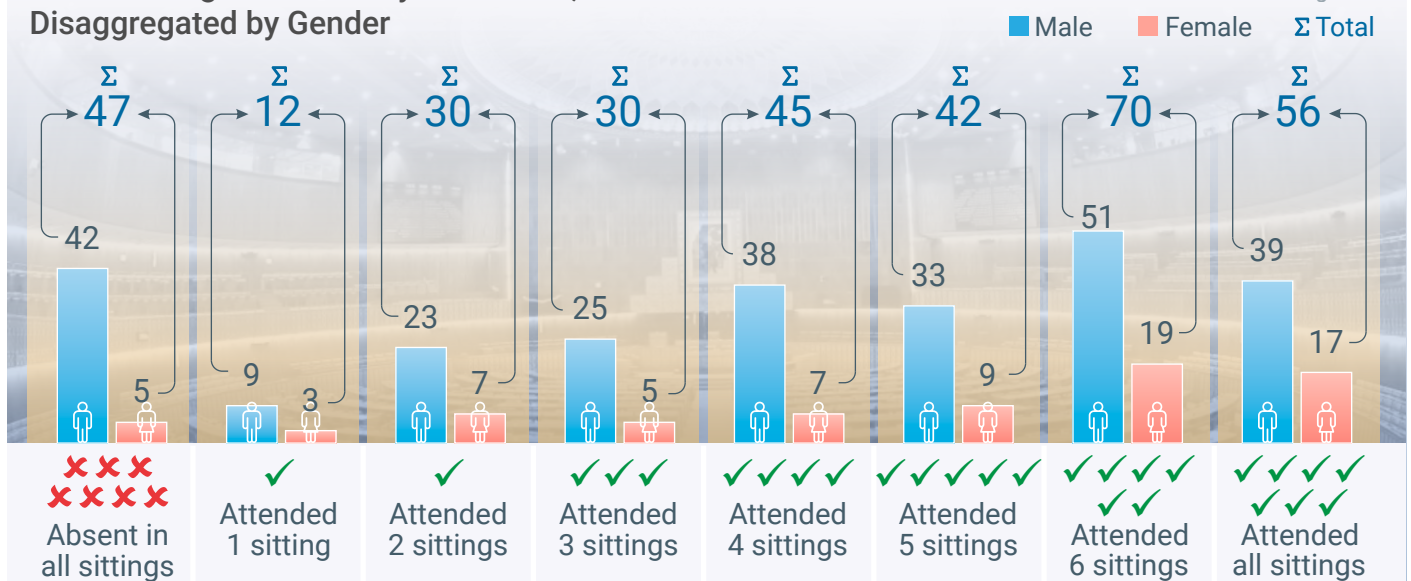

January 12 - 22, 2026

The 23rd session of the National Assembly comprised seven sittings between January 12 and January 22, 2026. According to official attendance records published on the Assembly's website, 56 members out of 332 (17 percent) attended all sittings, while 47 members (14 percent) were absent for the entire session. Figure-1 presents a gender-disaggregated breakdown of lawmakers based on the number of sittings attended.

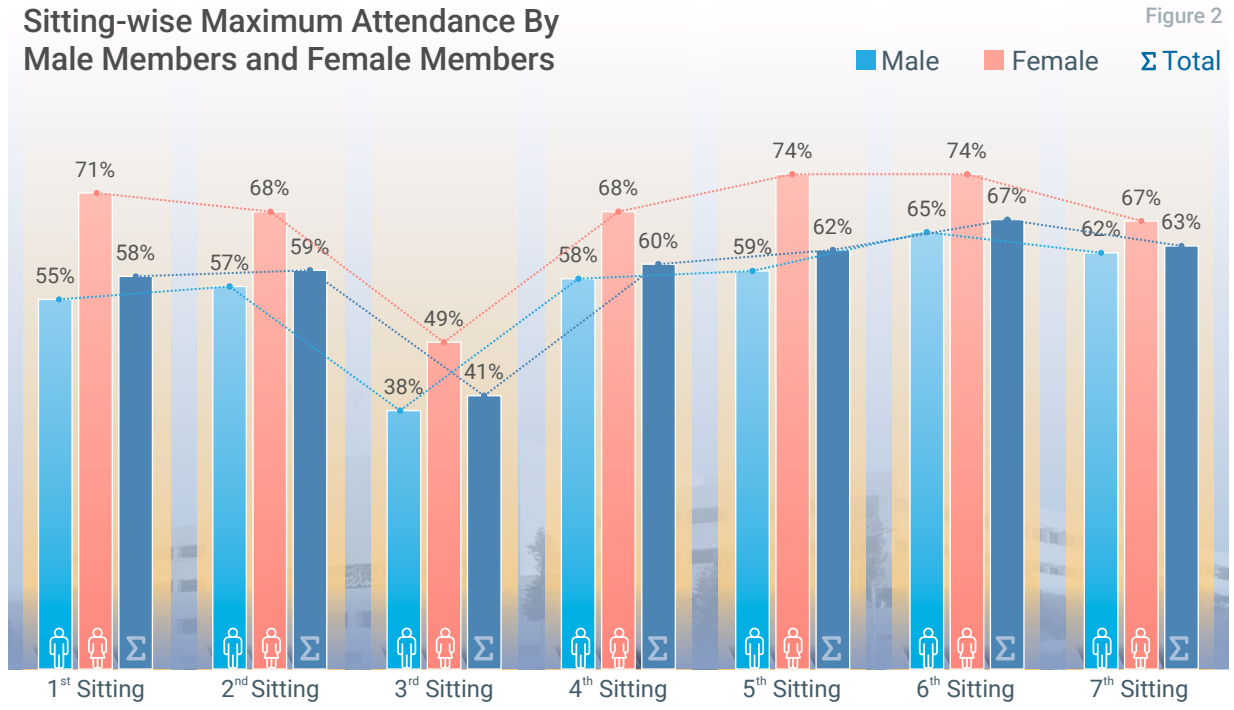
During the session, 32 members were suspended for not submitting annual statements of their assets and liabilities as required under Section 137 of the Election Act, 2017. The suspensions of 30 members were lifted during the session, while two remained suspended till the prorogation of the session. Meanwhile, four seats remained vacant during the session including NA-1 (Chitral Upper-cum-Chitral Lower), NA-175 (Muzaffargarh-I), NA-251 (Sherani-cum-Zhob-cum-Killa Saifullah), and one reserved seat for women from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa.

Key Highlights

- The sixth sitting had the highest number of Members of the National Assembly (MNAs) – 222 or 67 percent of current membership – present during the session.
- The third sitting had the lowest number of MNAs in attendance (135 or 41 percent).
- As many as 276 out of the 332 MNAs skipped at least one sitting during the session.
- Among the cabinet members from the National Assembly, only one minister attended all sittings, while seven did not attend any sitting during the session.
- The Prime Minister did not attend any sitting during the session.
- The Leader of the Opposition attended all four sittings after his appointment on January 16, 2026.

Figure 2 shows the gender-disaggregated percentage of MNAs present in each sitting.



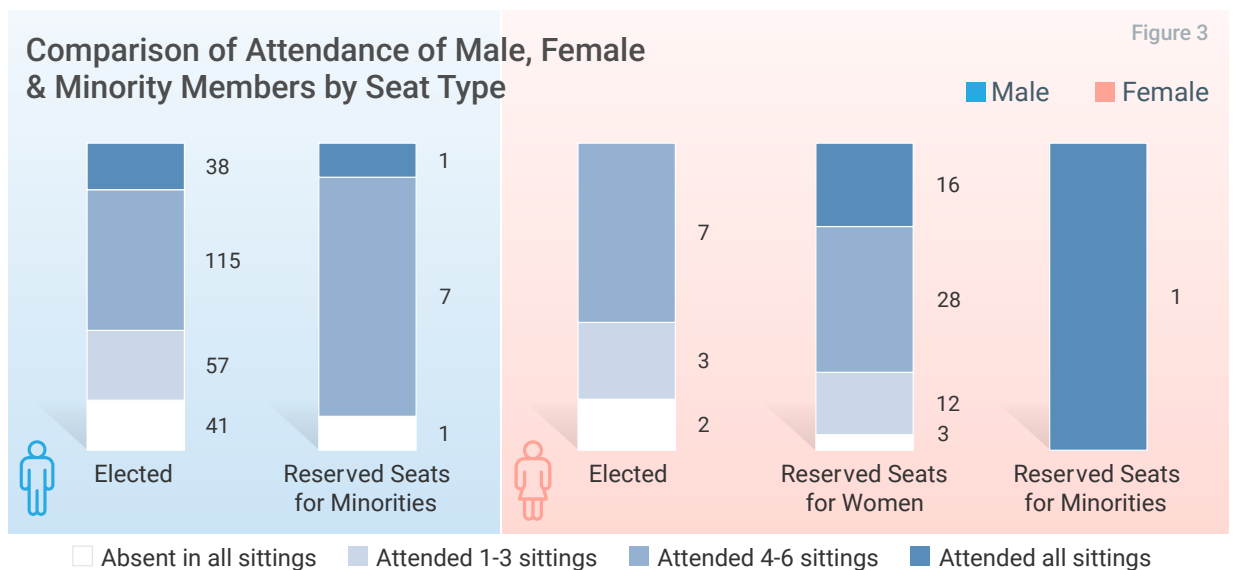
During the sitting with highest attendance (sixth), the House observed a Private Members' Day and witnessed the passage the Elections (Amendment) Bill, 2025 and the Corporate Social Responsibility Bill, 2025. The former bill sought to limit the public disclosure of legislators' assets and liabilities on the ground that it could compromise their security and privacy. The other bill formalized guidelines for corporate social

responsibility (CSR) expenditure by the for-profit companies registered with Securities and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP).

During the sitting with lowest attendance (third), the House saw introduction of eight government bills, and laying of two ordinances. Additionally, the House held Question Hour despite the Minister for Parliamentary Affairs suggesting to defer it due to low attendance.

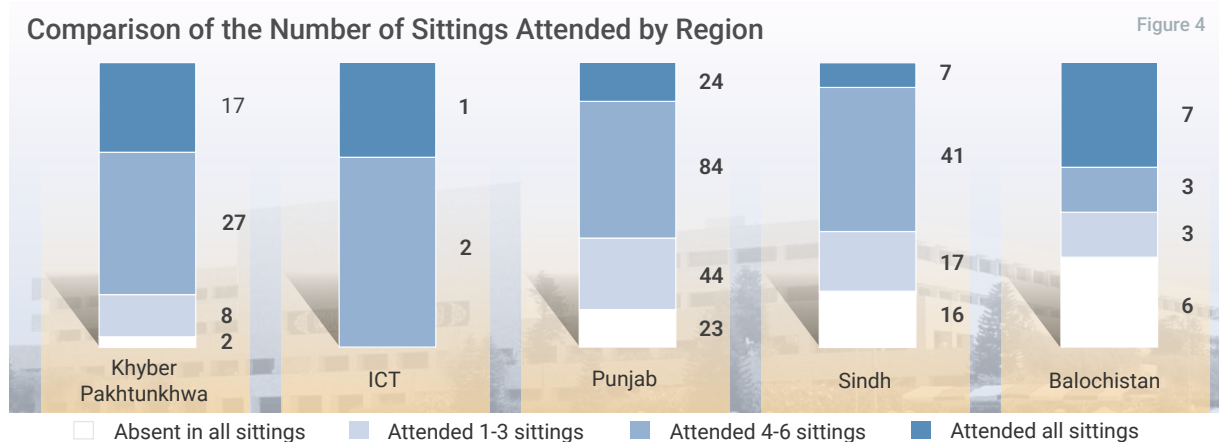
Attendance Patterns by Seat Type

Attendance Patterns by Party

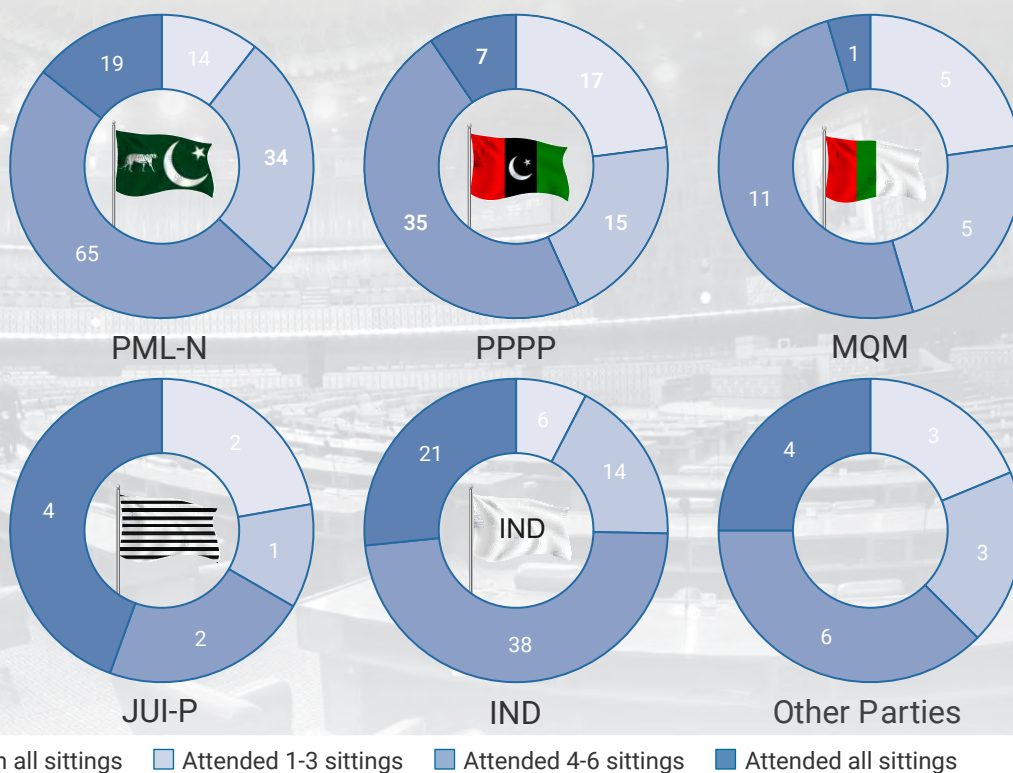
The National Assembly currently has representation of 13 parliamentary parties and 79 independents, as per the official website of the House. As many as eight of these parties and four independents sit on the government benches, while five parties and 75 independents

sit on the opposition benches. Overall, a majority of the members attended more than 50 percent of the sittings; however, the attendance pattern varies across parties. Figure 5 shows the party-wise number of MNAs, grouped by the number of sittings they attended during the session.

The bar titled "Others" represents all political parties with fewer than eight MNAs, including the SIC, BAP, MWMP, NP, PKMAP, PML, PML-Z, and the IPP. BNP's sole lawmaker has announced his resignation; however, it has not yet been formally accepted, as the National Assembly's website continues to list him as a sitting member. Additionally, the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) declared all members of the Sunni Ittehad Council (SIC)—who are Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf-backed—as independent candidates. Consequently, the number of independent MNAs has increased. Of these independents, four align with the government benches, while 75 sit on the opposition side.



For Figures 3, 4 and 5, the MNAs have been categorized into four groups as below:

1. MNAs who did not attend any sitting during the session are classified as "did not attend any sitting";
2. MNAs who attended at least one sitting but their overall attendance remained below 50 percent or half of the sittings, classified as "Attended 1-3 Sittings";
3. MNAs who attended more than 50 percent of the sittings but skipped at least one sitting, classified as "Attended 4-6 Sittings";
4. MNAs who attended all sittings, classified as "Attended All Sittings".

Ministerial Attendance

During the session, 29 federal ministers, including 23 MNAs and six senators, were scheduled to respond to members' queries during Question Hour. However, 19 ministers were marked absent on the day when their questions were listed for answers, while only 10 ministers attended as required.

As many as 10 Calling Attention Notices required responses from eight ministers. Five of these notices were addressed by the respective

ministries, one was responded to by another cabinet colleague, two were answered by the parliamentary secretary of the same ministry, and two were not taken up.

Figures 6 and 7 show the number of sittings attended by each federal minister and minister of state from the Lower House, based on official records available on the National Assembly website.

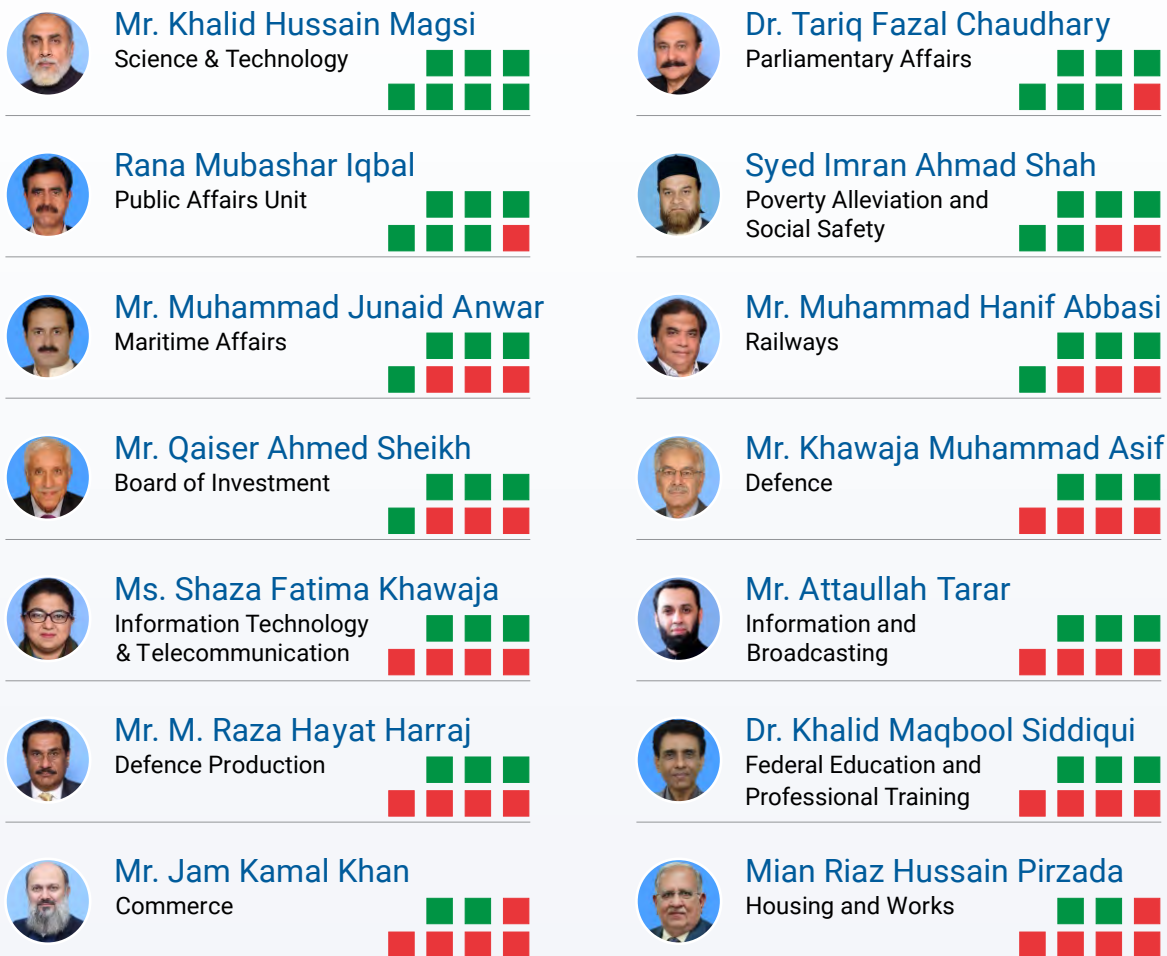
The incumbent cabinet comprises 55 members, including the Prime Minister and 31 Federal Ministers (25 MNAs and six Senators). In addition, there are 11 Ministers of State, four Advisors, and nine Special Assistants to the Prime Minister. Furthermore, 24 Parliamentary Secretaries assist the federal ministers in their parliamentary duties, but they do not hold the status of cabinet members.

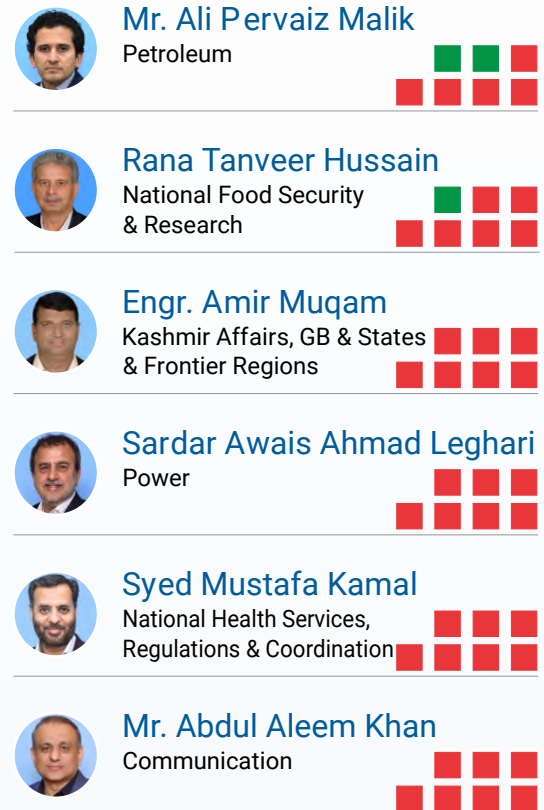
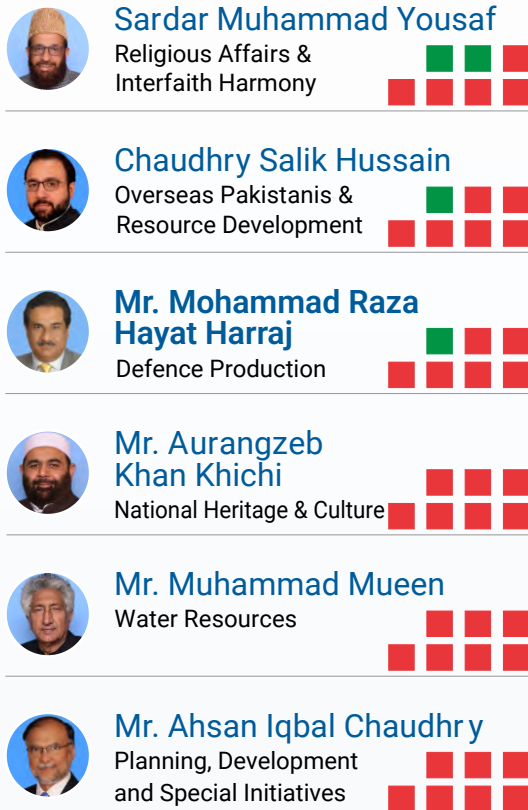

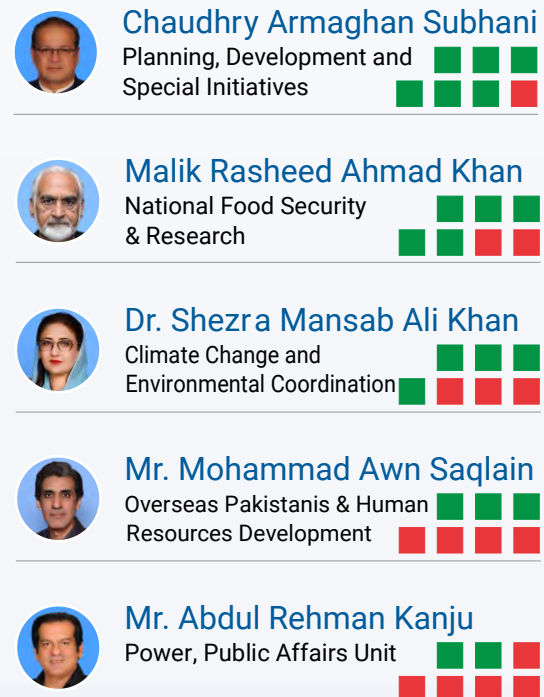
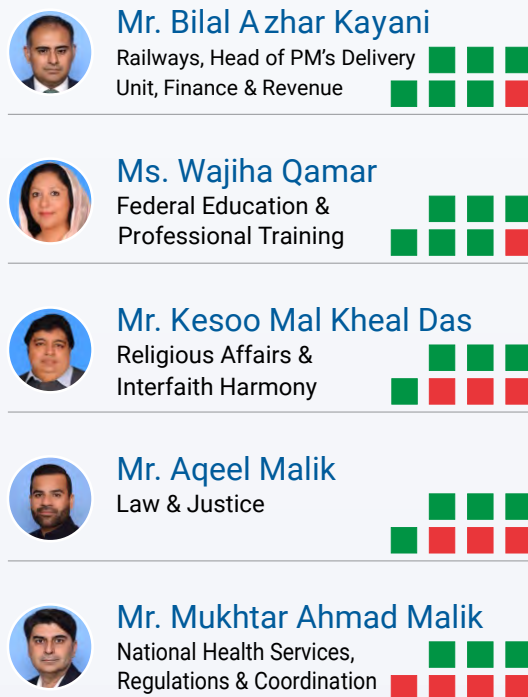

■ Leave and Absence Patterns

This section presents an analysis of leave requests from the preceding 22nd session. The details on leave requests read during the reporting (23rd) session have yet to be provided on the National Assembly website. It will be covered along with the attendance report of the upcoming (24th) session.

An analysis of attendance records and leave applications read out during the 22nd session proceedings shows that 299 members (99 percent of the current strength) missed at least one sitting during the preceding session. Of these, only 89 members submitted applications requesting leave from the House for their absence, while 210 did not. However, they are procedurally allowed to submit leave applications in subsequent sessions.

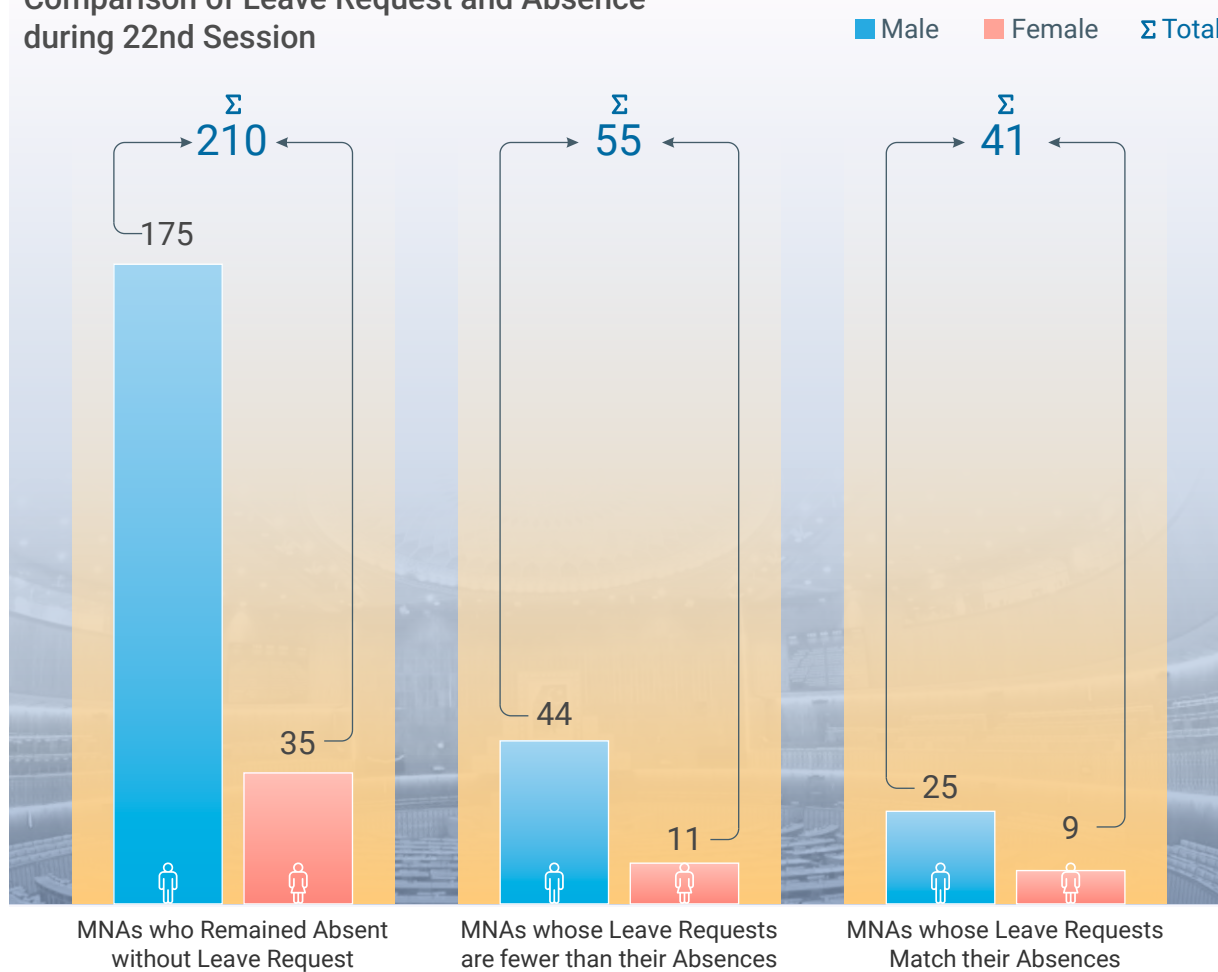
Among these 89 applicants who applied for leave, 25 members (28 percent) applied in advance, while 37 members (42 percent) submitted applications ex post facto, that is,

after returning from their leave. The leave applications of the remaining 27 members (30 percent) did not clearly fall into either the advance or ex post facto categories, as these applications were read out on a sitting falling in-between the members' leave period.

Furthermore, 34 members sought leave for the entire duration of their absence, whereas 55 members were absent for longer than the number of days for which they had requested leave. Figure 8 presents a gender-wise comparative analysis of the leave requests and absences.

The Attendance Report Card of the Members of the National Assembly of Pakistan is an initiative by the Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) aimed at promoting transparency and accountability by making the performance of elected representatives accessible to the public. Their attendance serves as a key indicator of their commitment to legislative responsibilities, including representing their constituents, contributing to policy debates, and holding the government accountable.

This report presents a detailed analysis of MNAs' attendance during the plenary sittings of the National Assembly's 23rd session, held from January 12 to 22, 2026. It provides insights into attendance trends across regions, political parties, and gender, highlighting levels of engagement among lawmakers. The report relies on the verbatim debates for leave records of MNA.

Since 2010, FAFEN has been systematically observing and reporting on the plenary proceedings of the federal Parliament and Provincial Assemblies. These efforts have significantly contributed to enhancing parliamentary transparency and strengthening the connection between citizens and their elected representatives, fostering a more inclusive and accountable democratic process.
