## Overall Attendance Distribution

The 361<sup>st</sup> session comprised eight sittings between May 11 and May 21, 2026. The charts below show distribution of members by number of sittings they attended, disaggregated by gender and the seat type i.e. general, technocrats and ulema, reserved for minorities, and reserved for women. Currently, the House has 95 members as one seat from Khyber Pakhtunkhwa remains vacant.

### Attendance Category Breakdown

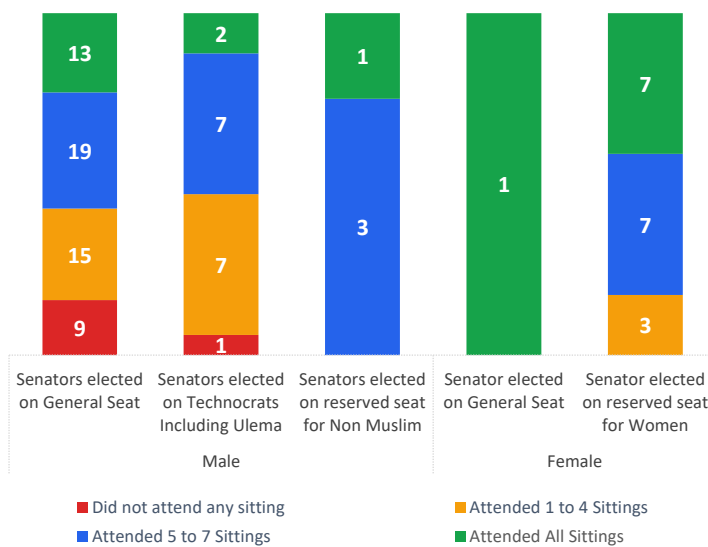

## About the Report

The Report on the Attendance of the Members of the Senate of Pakistan is an initiative by the Free and Fair Election Network (FAFEN) aimed at promoting transparency and accountability by making the performance of elected representatives accessible to the public. Their attendance serves as a key indicator of their commitment to legislative responsibilities, including representing their constituents, contributing to policy debates, and holding the government accountable.

This report presents a detailed analysis of Senate's attendance during the plenary sittings of the Senate's 361<sup>st</sup> session. It provides insights into attendance trends across regions, political parties, and gender and covers the attendance of

private lawmakers and cabinet ministers. The report relies on the official attendance and leave records of Senators made available on the website of the Senate.

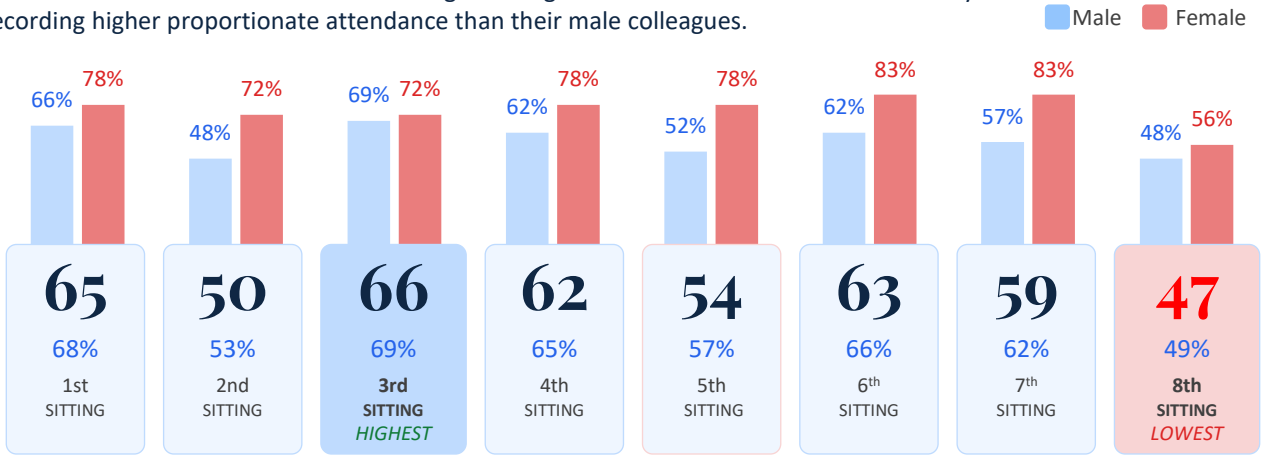

These efforts have significantly contributed to enhancing parliamentary transparency and strengthening the connection between citizens and their elected representatives, fostering a more inclusive and accountable democratic process.

## 02 — SESSION TIMELINE

### Attendance Patterns by Sitting

The Senators attendance varied across eight sittings with female lawmakers consistently recording higher proportionate attendance than their male colleagues.



**3rd Sitting (Highest Attendance):** The sitting addressed the 53 percent of the scheduled while the House also adopted an amendment to the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Senate, 2012 moved as supplementary agenda.

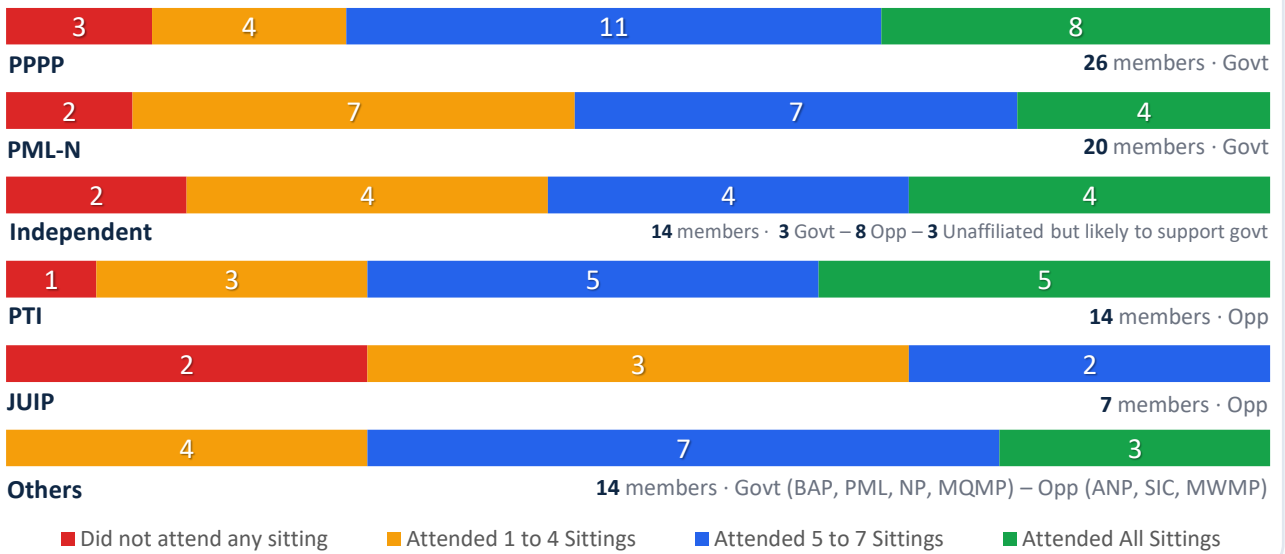
**8th Sitting (Lowest Attendance):** The sitting addressed 88 percent of the scheduled agenda including passage of a supplementary resolution.

The Senate currently has 11 parliamentary parties and 14 independents. Six parties and three independents sit on government benches while five parties and three independents on opposition benches.

Senators grouped by the parties they represent and number of sittings they attended

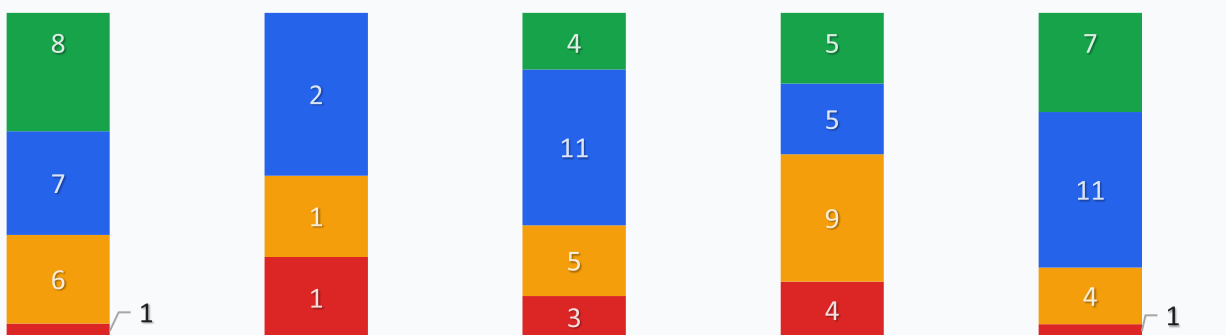


The "Others" bar includes parties with less than five members in the House, i.e. SIC, BAP, MWMP, NP, PML, MQMP and ANP

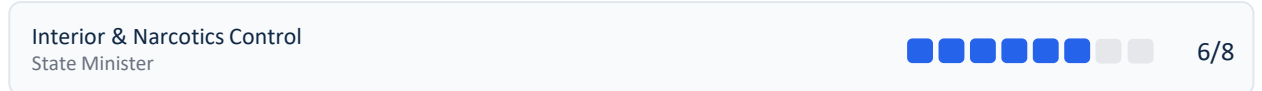

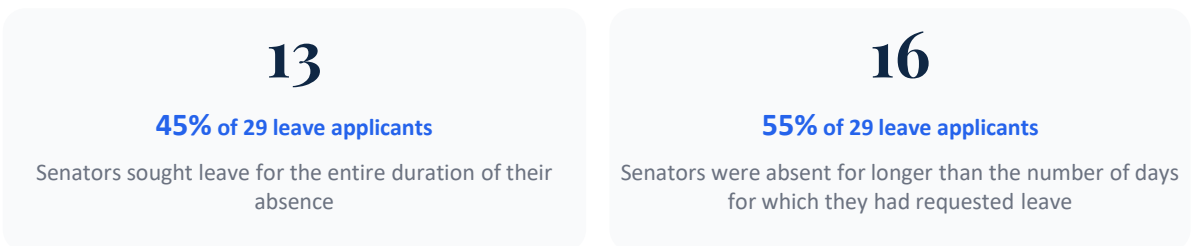


##### Timing of Application
